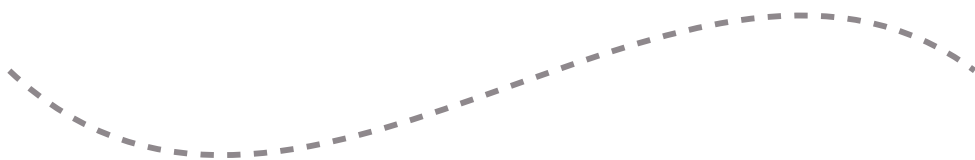
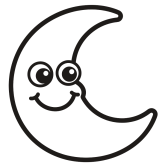
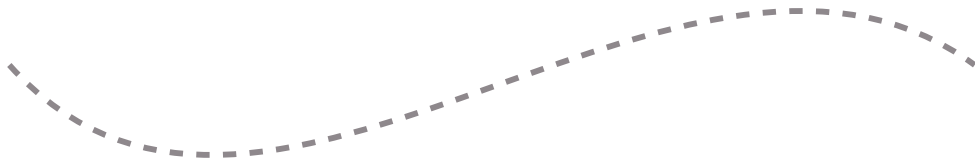


Trace the curvy paths

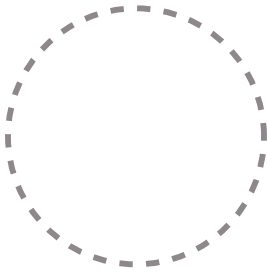

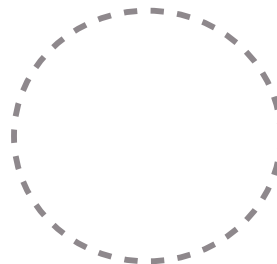

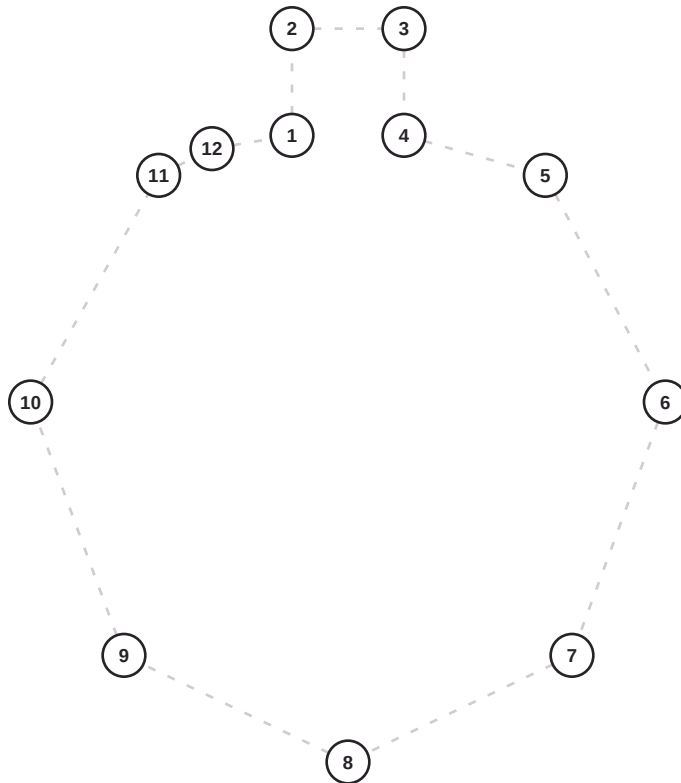

Maze and dots

Pages 7-8 practice planning, visual tracking and stopping at a target. Offer help with number order.

Scissor safety

Pages 9-10 require close adult supervision and child-safe scissors. Cut the card row off first if helpful.
